## BROADWAY.

by that on the 30 th + 31 st. days of august 1865 up to be known by the name of Broadway. To wit: - Situate in the country of Union & State of Ohio. Beginning in the center of Bradway road and in the south line of the Itlantie and Great Western Railway - There with said line D. 43° W. 49 poles to a stake in the west line of Survey No, 829. Thence with said line & 814° W31/2 poles to a stake. Thence n 43° E. about 11/2 poles to a stone with brick underneath. Thence \$ 470 E. 25 poles to a stake. Thence n. 43° E. 63 poles to a stake. Thence n 47° M. 11 poles to a stake. Thence n 43° E. to the center of said Broadway road. There with said road \$730 W to the beginning - lontaining 103/4 acres. Part of Survey No 829. Front Street Vis 2 poles unde, all other streets are 4 poles wide, all alleys are 1 pole wide. all lots except no 24+25 are 4 by 10 poles. And we do dedicate to public use all the said streets valleys as above described and represented upon the above plat. In testimony whereof we have hereinto set our hands and affected our sales this 1/2h. day of Sept. J.D. 1865.

Ind the said Many It branston wife of said Peleg branston bring at the same time examined by me separate and apart from her said husband and the contents of said mistrument bring made known to her by me she then declared that she did voluntarily sign, seal and acknowledge the same and that she is still statisfied therewith, this 11th. day of September IT. D. 1865.

There is upon the foregoing mistrument a five crut U.S. Revenue stamp to the certificate of F.S. Mowny the Surveyor, and also a five cent U.S. Revenue stamp to the acknowledgement, both duly cancelled.
