December 17, 1881.

J. B. Whippley, Nathan Howard ^{and} Uriah Cahill Commissioners of Union County met in regular session at the Auditor's Office pursuant to adjournment from Dec. 7, 1881. J. M. Hoskins and other citizens of the Village of Magnetic Springs Union County Ohio, filed a Petition with the Board of Commissioners signed by thirty electors residents within the proposed corporate limits praying for the organization of corporation of the territory described in their Petition accompanied by a map thereof as required by Section Nos. 1554 ^{and} 1555 Revised Statutes of Ohio.

Petition -

To the Honorable Board of Commissioners of Union County, Ohio.

Gentlemen:- We the undersigned residents electors of the Village of Magnetic Springs, who reside within the limits of the proposed corporation respectfully ask your Honorable Board to incorporate or organize into a village to be known as the town of Magnetic Springs. The territory described below under title 12-chapter two of the Revised Statutes of Ohio, Section 1553. We further estimate the inhabitants of said proposed Village at two hundred. We further request ^{to} appoint James Hoskins as our Agent in the proceedings of said Incorporation.

Description -

Situated in the County of Union, State of Ohio and in Hesburg Township being part of Original Survey No. 3696. commencing in the center of Bokes Creek or a point in line with James M^c. Bride's easterly line or corner thence southerly parallel with the Will Johns Gravel Road to the Nashville Ditch. thence westerly through the lands of J. W. Hoskins to the Will Johns Gravel Road ^{and} continuing the same course through the Lands of M. D. Degood parallel with Willard Street in N. D. Degood's second addition to the town of Magnetic Springs, thence northerly with the west line of Degood Street to the South line of Willard Street, thence westerly with the south line of Willard Street through the Lands of Mrs. A. J. Degood and Abalom Liggett to the center of Bokes Creek, thence easterly following the meanderings of the Creek to Martha Jenkins' southwest corner. thence north with Martha Jenkins' West line to the center of the Hopewell Road, thence easterly with the center of said road to the Will Johns Gravel Road. ^{and} continuing said line in said Hopewell Road to a point north of the place of beginning. thence southerly to the place of beginning.

In the matter of the Petition for the Incorporation of Magnetic Springs.

The citizens of the Village of Magnetic Springs county of Union and State of Ohio, having by their duly authorized Agent J. M. Hoskins filed their certain Petition according to law on the 17th day of December 1881. signed by 37 electors residing within the territory proposed to be incorporated, said territory being carefully and accurately described in said Petition and the maps thereof filed therewith and the said Petition having been set for hearing by the Board of County Commissioners on the 8th day of March 1882 and the matter having been considered by the Board on said 8th day of March 1882 and by request of the Agent J. M. Hoskins and the principal Petitioners all proceedings on said Petition having been continued to this day and the Commissioners now being present, J. B. Whelpley and Nathan Howard and having met to consider said Petition and proof being made satisfactory to the Board that lawful notice had been given to all parties interested by publication in the Union County Journal a newspaper published in and of general circulation in the County of Union and State of Ohio for six consecutive weeks before the day set for hearing, said Petition and also by posting of notices as requested by law within the territory described in said Petition and all parties being now present, therupon the cause came on to be heard on said Petition and maps and evidence and all parties being heard and the Board finding that the name proposed for said Corporation is appropriate and the limits of the territory are not unreasonably small or large and that there is the requisite population for said corporation and the Board of Commissioners of Union County Ohio being of the opinion that said territory should be incorporated as prayed for in the Petition and no written objection having been filed against said petition therupon Nathan Howard made a motion that the prayer of the Petitioners be granted and that the Corporation as named and as bed for in the petition may be organized and that said Village of Magnetic Springs shall hereafter contain within its corporate limits all of said territory described in said petition and covered by said Maps.


PLAT OF THE


