


## MILFORD PLAT



I hereby certify that I surveyed the adjoining plat for the citizens of Milford Center on the 7<sup>th</sup> day of March 1853 as follows:-

Beginning at a stake, one rod East, Two rods North of the N. E. corner of the ashery, from which stake a elm tree bears south 48 degrees E. 3 poles & 14 links, from thence run N 64° W 98 poles to a willow tree. Thence S 35° W 13 poles to a Sycamore on the North Bank of the Mill race. thence up the center of the race 130 poles to the West line of Standish Culver's land. Thence with his line S 20° degrees West 73 poles to a stake 2 poles south of the Rail-road, thence parallel with sd. Rail Road. S 36° E 20 p. S 82. E. 20 p. S 74 W. 20 p. S 72 E 117 poles to a stake. Then N. 33° E. 83 poles to the Beginning.

All of which will appear on the aforesaid plat.

Incorporation  
of  
Milford Center

According to a notice being given the citizens of  
Milford, met at the School House on Thursday Even-  
ing March 3<sup>rd</sup> 1853. F. Garwood was called to the  
chair and E. L. Reynolds appointed secretary.

The chairman stated the object of the meeting, to take into consider-  
ation the propriety of reviving the corporated authority of the Town of  
Milford in the County of Union and State of Ohio and extended  
the corporated limits thereof. After some preliminary remarks  
the following metes and bounds were submitted to a vote of meet-  
ing and carried.

Beginning Two Rods North and one Rod, East of the ashery of  
W. W. Wood. and running in a straight line to the south end of  
the Bridge & continuing in a straight line until it crosses the  
Springfield, Mt. Vernon and Pittsburg Rail Road the distance of Two  
Rods, thence south to the channel of the Mill Race. thence up the  
channel of said Race a sufficient distance to pass the lot and  
dwelling of Standish Bulver. thence south until it crosses the  
Columbus Pikeway and Indiana Rail Road. the distance of Two  
rods. Thence easterly in a parallel line with said Rail Road to a  
lane, leading to the pasture lands of Harvy Burnham's heirs.  
thence northerly in a straight line to the beginning.

On motion of Oliver Kennedy the following Resolution was  
adopted as the petition.

Be it resolved that we the undersigned legal voters and citizens  
of Milford do hereby petition the Commissioners of Union County  
State of Ohio. to incorporate the village of Milford a Body Politic  
under the name and style of Milford Center, according to the metes  
and bounds heretofore described.

On motion of John Elwell, E. L. Reynolds was authorized by  
a vote of the meeting to act as agent for the citizens of Milford to  
attend to getting a survey and plat of the above described bounds.  
and to present this petition to the proper authorities, stating  
the object thereof and to attend to such other business as may be  
necessary for the accomplishment of the object herein specified.
