

Town of Homer & Surveyed October 10<sup>th</sup> 1834 for Elisha Reynolds  
& others the Town of Homer situated on part of  
Elisha Reynolds Survey No 7789 & 1946 on the waters of Little Darby  
& Creek the County Road running on the line be-  
tween said surveys being the main street beginning at a stone on the east  
margin of said road in the line between Elisha Reynolds & James E Miller  
which is the south west corner of Lot No 1 the lines of the lots all run at  
right angles by the cardinal points of the compass bearing N 6° E & S  
84° E & their opposites said lots on the east side of Main are numbered  
progressively from South to North from No 1 to No 18 and on the west side  
of Main Street said lots are numbered from North to South from No 19 to  
35 South Street is 3 poles wide and runs between Lots No 3 & 1, & between  
Lots No 33 & 34 North Street is 3 poles wide and runs between Lots No 13 &  
No 14 & No 23 & No 24 each lot is eight poles long from the Main Street to  
the ally Lots No 9 & 28 are six poles wide Lots No 8 & 29 are four poles  
wide Lots No 30 & 7 are six poles & seven links wide Lots No 6 & 31 are  
four poles wide Lots No 5 & 32 are three and one half poles wide all other  
Lots in said Town excepting the ones above stated are five poles wide  
an ally of one pole wide runs on the back of all the lots across the  
Town
