

I know all hereby these presents that John H. Cook of Richwood Union County Ohio has caused a certain piece of land adjoining said John H. Cook's First Addition to said town of Richwood, Union County Ohio to be laid out into lots and alleys as represented on the accompanying plat (The street theron represented having been heretofore dedicated to public use <sup>as</sup> so recorded) under the name and style of John H. Cook's Second Addition to the Town of Richwood. And the said John H. Cook for himself and for his heirs, executors, administrators <sup>and</sup> assigns does hereby dedicate to public use all of said Alleys as shown on said plat which is made for record. In Testimony whereof the said John H. Cook and Barbary Cook his wife who hereby releases her right and expectancy of Dower in the lands dedicated to public use, have hereunto set their hands and seals this 1<sup>st</sup> day of June 1874.

State of Ohio, Union County s.s. Be it remembered that on the 1<sup>st</sup> day of June A.D. 1874 before me the subscriber a Notary Public in and for said County personally came John H. Cook and Barbary Cook his wife the grantors in the foregoing instrument and acknowledged the signing and sealing thereof to be their voluntary act and deed for the uses <sup>and</sup> purposes therin mentioned. And the said Barbary Cook, wife of the said John H. Cook being examined by me separate and apart from her said husband and the contents of said instrument being by me made known to her as the statute directs, declared that she did voluntarily sign, seal <sup>and</sup> acknowledge the same and that she is still satisfied therewith as her act and deed for the uses and purposes therin mentioned. In testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my official seal this 1<sup>st</sup> day of June A.D. 1874.

Surveyed for John H. Cook the plat of land described as follows Being part of Survey No 6293 in Glaiborne Township Union County Ohio Beginning at the N.E. corner of John H. Cook's First Addition to Richwood Ohio, Thence N 89 $\frac{3}{4}$  E. 48 $\frac{53}{60}$  poles to S. V. R. Young's west line. Thence S 17 $\frac{1}{2}$  E. 10 $\frac{27}{60}$  poles to a stake in said Youngs west line. Thence N 89 $\frac{3}{4}$  W. 48 $\frac{53}{60}$  poles to a stake in the east line of Cooks First Addition to Richwood. Thence N 17 $\frac{1}{4}$  W. with the east line thereof 10 $\frac{27}{60}$  poles to the place of Beginning. Containing Three  $\frac{13}{20}$  Acres of land.
