Know all men that Joshua S. Gill and Eliza T. C. Gill his wife of the County of Union and State of Ohio have caused a certain piece of land adjoining the town of Richwood in the County of Union and State of Ohio to be laid out into lots, streets and alleys as represented on the foregoing plat under the name and style of Joshua S. Gill's Addition to the town of Richwood. And we do hereby dedicate to public use all the said streets and alleys as represented on said plat.

Fulton Street is laid out same width as Fulton Street in the town of Richwood.

Walnut Street is 4 poles wide.

Franklin Street is the road from Richwood to Marysville.

The alleys are all 1 pole wide.

The above plat is made for the purpose of record.
