BE IT THEREFORE RESOLVED by the Board of Supervisors of the County of San Mateo. State of California, that this Board does hereby find, ascertain and determine that the building and erection of permanent quarters for the housing of the equipment of said fire district is a matter of urgency and necessity.

AND BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the War Industries Board, the State Counsel for Defense, and any other Board or official, from whom a permit for the crection of said building should be obtained, be, and they are hereby, respectfully requested to grant permission for the building of same.
