RESOLUTION.

WHEREAS, Menlo Park Fire District is a fire district whose territory covers the unincorporated town of Menlo Park, Atherton, and Camp Fremont, together with other adjacent territory, and by reason of the inclusion of said camp within said territory, the risk of fire has been augmented; and

WHEREAS, said Fire District at the present time houses its equipment in temporary quarters, to-wit, in a public garage, which said temporary quarters are in fact inappropriate for the housing of said equipment, and the lease whereof in fact expires early in the year 1919 and cannot be renewed; and

WHEREAS, said District is unable to secure adequate quarters for housing of its said equipment, and it has become necessary to provide for adequate permanent quarters for housing the same, and said District, in conjunction with certain residents therein, desires to build and erect a fire house at the cost of about Ten Thousand Dollars (\$10,000);

BE IT THEREFORE RESOLVED by the Board of Supervisors of the County of San Mateo, State of California, that this Board does hereby find, ascertain and determine that the building and erection of permanent quarters for the housing of the equipment of said fire district is a matter of urgency and necessity.

AND BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the War Industries Board, the State Council for Defense, and any other Board or official, from whom a permit for the erection of said building should be obtained, be, and they are hereby, respectfully requested to grant permission for the building of same.


Gentlemen:-

At a meeting of the Board of Fire Commissioners of the unincorporated town of Menlo Park, in the County of San Mateo, State of California, held on June 18th, 1917, it was estimated and determined by the said Board of Fire Commissioners that the sum of Five thousand and five hundred Dollars (\$5500.00) is the annual amount required for the maintenance of the Menlo Park Fire Department for the ensuing fiscal year.

WHEREFORE, your honorable body is respectfully requested to levy and raise a tax amounting to Five thousand and five hundred Dollars (\$5500.00), at the time of levying the county taxes in 1917, on the taxable property contained within the boundaries of the Menlo Park Fire District as set forth in a description filed in the office of the County Recorder of San Mateo County on the 16th day of June, 1916; and cause the moneys arising from and out of said tax to be paid into the custody of the Treasurer of the County of San Mateo, by him to be kept subject only to the order of said Board of Fire Commissioners of the Menlo Park Fire District.

To the Honorable Board of Supervisors of the

Gentlemen:-

We, the undersigned, members of and constituting a ma-
jority of the Board of Fire Commissioners of the Menlo Park Fire
District of the County of San Lateo, State of California, hereby
certify to your honorable body the following facts, to-wit:

First:-

That at a meeting of the Board of Fire Commissioners
of said Menlo Park Fire District held on June 16th, 1916:

Present: Fire Commissioners A. G. C. Hahn and C. W. Larwedel,--
Fire Commissioner C. R. Walter being absent from the State of Cal-
ifornia, -- the following proceedings were had:

Fire Commissioner C. W. Larwedel presented to said Board and
moved the adoption of the following resolution, viz:
RESOLVED, That the fire limits of the Menlo Park Fire District be,
and they hereby are, fixed and established as described in the De-
scription of the Boundaries of the Menlo Park Fire District here-
inafter contained; that said description of the Boundaries of the
Menlo Park Fire District shall be subscribed by the members of this
Board or a majority of them; and that a copy of said description
of the Boundaries of the Menlo Park Fire District, subscribed in
like manner, be filed in the office of the Recorder of San Lateo
County, State of California.

DESCRIPTION OF THE BOUNDARIES
OF THE MENLO PARK FIRE DISTRICT.

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Beginning at a point where the southeasterly line of the tract of land shown on map No. 1 of "Dumbarton Oaks", which said map is filed with the County Recorder of San Mateo County, in Book 5 of Maps, at page 56, intersects the northeasterly line of the State Highway, also known as El Camino Real; thence northeasterly on and along the said southeasterly line of "Dumbarton Oaks" and the northeasterly extension thereof across the right-of-way of the Southern Pacific Railroad to the southeasterly corner of the tract of land shown on map of "Dumbarton", which said map is recorded in the office of the County Recorder of San Mateo County, in Book 5 of Maps, at page 32 thereof; thence northeasterly on and along the southeasterly line of said "Dumbarton Tract" to the southerly line of the Southern Pacific Railroad right-of-way, known as Dumbarton Cut-off; thence northeasterly on and along the line of said right-of-way to a point on the southwesterly line of the roadway shown on the map of "Subdivisions of Sweeney Ranch," which said map is recorded in the office of the County Recorder of San Mateo County, in Book 2 of Maps, at page 97 thereof; thence southeasterly on and along said southwesterly line of said roadway and the southeasterly extension of said line to the southeasterly line of Marsh Road; thence southwesterly on and along the said southeasterly line of Marsh Road to the intersection of the south line of Bay Road; thence in a general easterly direction along the said southerly line of Bay Road to the intersection of said line with the westerly line of Cooley Avenue; thence



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southerly on and along the said westerly line of said Cooley Avenue and the southerly extension of said line to the center of San Francisco Creek; thence in a general southwesterly direction along the center of San Francisco Creek to a point where the southerly line of a road leading from Stanford University to Santa Cruz Ave., at a point near the J. H. Meyer tract, intersects the center line of said creek; thence westerly on and along the southerly line of said road leading from Stanford University to Santa Cruz Ave. and the westerly extension of said line to the westerly line of said Santa Cruz Ave.; thence along the said last mentioned line of Santa Cruz Ave. to a point on the southerly boundary line of the aforesaid J. H. Meyer tract; thence westerly along the southerly boundary line of the said J. H. Meyer tract to a point on the southeasterly line of a road known as the Menlo Park to Searsville Road; thence northeasterly on and along the said southeasterly line of the Menlo Park to Searsville Road to a point where said line is intersected by the southeasterly extension of the dividing line between the properties of Sharon and Zerner; thence northwesterly on and along said extension of said dividing line and on and along said dividing line and continuing northwesterly along the northeasterly line of the said Sharon property and continuing northwesterly along the southwesterly line of Altschul Ave., as same is shown on map of University Heights as recorded in the office of the County Recorder of San Mateo County, in Book 1 of Maps, page 96 thereof, and also continuing northwesterly along the line of Altschul Ave., as same is shown on the map of Menlo Heights, recorded in the office of the County Recorder of San Mateo County, in Book of Maps 2, page 32, to the intersection of said line of Altschul Ave. with the southeasterly line of Walsh Road; thence northeasterly along said line of Walsh Road to the southwesterly line of the Alameda de las Pulgas; thence in a general northwesterly direction along the said southwesterly

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line of Alameda de las Pulgas to the easterly line of the County Road leading from Redwood City to Woodside; thence northerly along the said easterly line of said County Road to a point where said line is intersected by the dividing line between the lands of T. M. Horgan and the tract of land shown on Map of "Oakleigh Park Tract", which said map is recorded in the office of the County Recorder of San Mateo County, in Book 7 of Maps, at page 16 thereof; thence southeasterly on and along the said dividing line to the intersection of said dividing line and the dividing line between the lands of T. M. Horgan and L. M. Gray; thence northeasterly on and along the southwesterly line of the lands of said L. M. Gray to the southwesterly corner of the lands of F. W. Eaton; thence northeasterly along the southwesterly boundary of the said lands of F. W. Eaton to the southwesterly corner of the lands of Helen W. Henshaw; thence northeasterly along the southwesterly line of the lands of the said Helen W. Henshaw to the southwesterly corner of the S. G. Johnson 6-acre tract; thence northeasterly along the southwesterly line of said S. G. Johnson tract to the southwesterly corner of Lot 17, as same is shown on map of "Oakwood Park", which said map is recorded with the County Recorder of San Mateo County, in Book 3 of Maps, at page 20 thereof; thence southeasterly on and along the southwesterly boundary line of Lot 17 to the southwesterly corner of Lot 18 of said "Oakwood Park"; thence North 32°30' East to the northwesterly corner of Lot No. 1 of said "Oakwood Park" and continuing North 32°30' East to the northeasterly line of the aforesaid El Camino Real; thence southeasterly along the said line of said El Camino Real to the point of beginning.

Said motion and resolution was seconded by Fire Commissioner A. G. C. Eahn, and upon being presented by the Chairman to said Board said resolution was unanimously adopted; Fire Commissioners C. W. Marwedel and A. G. C. Eahn voting "aye"; noes, none. Thereupon a majority of said Board of Fire Commissioners subscribed said Description of the Boundaries of the Menlo Park Fire District, and they also subscribed a copy thereof.

Thereupon, Fire Commissioner C. W. Marwedel presented to said Board and moved the adoption of the following resolution and order,

viz:

RESOLVED, That it is, in the judgment of this Board, advisable to call an election and submit to the electors of this fire district the question whether or not a tax shall be levied and raised for the purpose of providing money to the amount of Fourteen thousand Dollars (\$14000.00) for the purposes specified in the form of notice of election hereinafter in this resolution contained, which is hereby referred to for particulars; that such election shall be called for, and the same shall be held, on the date and at the place specified in the said form of notice; that for the holding of such election all the territory within the exterior boundaries of the Menlo Park Fire District as fixed and established by this Board shall constitute but one precinct; that the polls shall be opened during the period and between the hours specified in said form of notice; that the persons named in said form of notice as Judges and Clerks, being competent persons and qualified electors of said fire district, are hereby appointed as Judges and Clerks respectively to conduct said election; that said election shall be held as prescribed in the Political Code of the State of California, and that said Judges and Clerks shall make return thereof, pursuant to law; that the said election shall be so called by posting notices thereof, signed by this Board, one at the Post Office in Menlo Park, one at the railroad station of the Southern Pacific Company at Atherton, and one at the intersection of Santa Cruz Avenue with the State Highway or Camino Real in Menlo Park, three of the most public places in said district, for not less than ten days before the date of said election; that there is no newspaper published within the boundaries of said district; that the chairman of this Board is hereby directed to post said notices, or cause the same to be posted, all in accordance with this resolution; and that the said notices so to be posted shall be signed by this Board, and shall be in words and figures as follows, to-wit:

FIRE DEPARTMENT TAX ELECTION NOTICE.

Submitting to the Electors of the Menlo Park Fire District of San Mateo County, State of California, the Question whether or not a Tax for the Establishment and Equipment of a Fire Department shall be levied and raised.

(Pax) NOTICE is hereby given to the qualified electors of the Menlo Park Fire District in the County of San Mateo, State of California, that in accordance with the provisions of the Political Code of the State of California, an election will be held on the 27th day of June, 1916, at that certain building designated as the Menlo Park Public School, located on the State Highway (or Camino Real) between Glenwood Avenue and Oak Grove Avenue in said fire district, between the hours of eight o'clock a.m. and five o'clock p.m. of said day, during which period and between which hours the polls shall remain open continuously, at which election the question of levying and raising a tax amounting to fourteen thousand (14000.00) dollars for the purpose of establishing and equipping a fire department for the said district and for protecting the same from loss by fire, will be voted upon;

That all the territory included within the exterior boundaries of the Menlo Park Fire District as fixed and established by the Board of Fire Commissioners for said district, a description of which boundaries is hereto annexed, shall constitute but one precinct for the holding of such election;

That every qualified elector residing within the boundaries of said Menlo Park Fire District may cast one vote, either in favor of or against the levying and raising of said tax;

That there shall be and appear upon the ballots used at said election the words: "Tax--Yes" and "Tax--No", and any elector desiring to vote in favor of said tax shall put a cross (X) upon his ballot with pencil or ink after the words "Tax--Yes" and any elector desiring to vote against said tax shall put a cross (X) upon his ballot in pencil or ink after the words "Tax--No". Any ballot so used and duly voted and marked with a cross (X) after the words "Tax--Yes" shall be canvassed and counted as provided by law as a vote in favor of levying and raising said tax. Any ballot so used and duly voted and marked with a cross (X) after the words "Tax--No" shall be canvassed and counted as provided by law as a vote against levying and raising said tax;

That Philip C. Sales, William J. Murray, and Frank C. Wickpatrick will act as Judges, and Meta E. Rueler and Florence F. Logan will act as Clerks of said election and conduct the same, said judges and clerks being competent and qualified electors of said fire district.

And notice is further given, that said election is called and will be held, and this notice is given, pursuant to a resolution and order adopted by a majority of the members of said Board of Fire Commissioners of said fire district, at a meeting of said Board duly held on the 16th day of June, 1916, at which meeting there were present the two subscribing commissioners, the third commissioner being absent from the State.

Said motion, resolution and order was seconded by Fire Commissioner A. G. C. Kahn, and upon being presented by the Chairman to the said Board said resolution was unanimously adopted; Fire Commissioners C. W. Larwedel and A. G. C. Kahn voting "aye"; none none.

Thereafter, on the 16th day of June, 1916, at 11.24 A. M. the aforesaid subscribed copy of the Description of the Boundaries of the Menlo Park Fire District was filed in the office of the County Recorder of San Mateo County, State of California.

Second:-

That notice of the election referred to in the above order was given by posting notices thereof as required by law, and more particularly by Section four (4) of an Act of the Legislature of the State of California designated as Act 1174 of the General Laws of the State of California, which said notices so posted contained all the matters and things required by said Act that they should contain, and that said notices were posted at three of the most public places in said Menlo Park Fire District, said places being designated in a resolution and order heretofore recited, at least ten days before the day of such election; as appears from the affidavit of A. G. C. Kahn hereto annexed and which is hereby referred to and made part hereof.

Third:-

That such election was held on the 27th day of June, 1916, in the Menlo Park Public School in the Menlo Park Fire District, County of San Mateo, State of California, and that such election was conducted by the officers named in the resolution and order hereinbefore recited, said officers having duly taken the required oath of office and subscribed their respective names thereto in the "Poll List" hereto annexed and which is referred to and made part hereof; and that such election was conducted in all respects in conformity with the law governing such elections.

Fourth:-

That thereafter there were duly canvassed, counted, certified to and returned the total number of votes cast at said election, also the total number of votes cast thereat for "Tax-yes", and the total number of votes cast thereat for "Tax-no"; that the result of

election officers that said election had been carried by "Tax-yes",
as will more fully appear by the certificate of said election officers hereto attached and made part hereof.

Fifth:- That this Board of Fire Commissioners of the Menlo Park Fire District canvassed the returns made to it by the election officers; and that it appeared by and from the canvass of said returns that the total number of votes cast at said election was one hundred and fifty-eight (158); that of said one hundred and fifty-eight votes so cast as aforesaid one hundred (100) of said votes were cast for "Tax-yes", and fifty-eight (58) of said one hundred and fifty-eight votes cast were cast for "Tax-no"; and this Board of Fire Commissioners so finds and now so certifies to your honorable body.

Sixth:- That a majority of all the votes cast at said election were in favor of said tax, viz: one hundred (100) votes out of one hundred and fifty-eight (158) votes, the total number of votes cast at said election, were cast for "Tax-yes".

Seventh:- That the amount of money to be raised and collected by said tax, and voted for at such election, to-wit: the sum of Fourteen thousand Dollars (\$14000.00) does not exceed one per-cent of the assessable property within said fire limits as fixed by the said Board of Fire Commissioners, *as will more fully appear by the certificate of the Assessor of the County of San Mateo, hereto attached and made part hereof.*

Eighth:- That the original and correct "Poll List" of electors and "Tally List" of said election and the certificate of the election officers are hereto annexed and made a part hereof.

Ninth:- That this Board has caused an entry of all the foregoing facts and proceedings to be made and entered upon its minutes.

WHEREFORE, the said Board of Fire Commissioners respectfully requests your honorable body to levy and raise a tax amounting to Fourteen thousand Dollars (\$14000.00) at the time of levying the county taxes on the taxable property contained within the boundaries of said Menlo Park Fire District hereinbefore described, in manner prescribed by said Act 1174 of the General Laws of California, and cause the moneys arising from and out of said tax to be paid in to the custody of the Treasurer of the County of San Mateo, and by
