

WSJ: Texting While Walking Slows You Down

Slow and Wonky


Researchers at Australia's University of Queensland have found that people change the way they walk when they text while on the move. This puts them off-balance and makes them less likely to walk in a straight line.

Note: In the study, 26 adults were asked to walk normally under three conditions: with their phones in their pockets; while reading from their mobile phones; and while typing 'the quick brown fox jumps over the lazy dog.' The order of the conditions was randomized and in each condition participants were asked to walk in a straight line over a distance of 27.9 feet.




How Many Teens Are Distracted and Why?

How Does a Teenager Cross the Road?

Older teens now account for half of all pedestrian deaths among children 19 and under. In the last five years, pedestrian injuries among 16-19 year olds increased 25% over the previous five years.²

How big a problem is distraction? To find out, Safe Kids observed 34,325 middle and high school students crossing the street in a school zone. Here's what we learned.



One in five high schoolers and one in eight middle schoolers were observed crossing the street while distracted.




Teens who were distracted were most frequently texting or wearing headphones.

Glassboro pedestrian struck, injured by car

<u>GLASSBORO</u> — A 19-year-old woman was hospitalized Monday evening after being struck by a car.

Police say the incident happened just after 10 p.m. The woman, whose name was not released, was using the crosswalk at the traffic circle near the intersection of Mullica Hill Road (Route 322) and Rowan Boulevard when she was struck by a four-door sedan.

The driver of the car, also an unidentified 19-year-old woman, was unhurt. She remained at the scene and cooperated with police. The pedestrian was taken to Cooper Hospital's trauma center with moderate injuries.

Glassboro police, along with the borough fire department and Rowan University police, were on the scene. The incident was still under investigation Tuesday morning.

<u>TETERBORO</u> — A man was killed by a vehicle while crossing Route 46 in Teterboro, police said.

The man, 43, was crossing at about 6:15 a.m. from the south side of the highway, where a bus stop is located just east of Industrial Avenue, Moonachie Detective Sgt. Anthony Fugnitti said. He was not in the crosswalk, Fugnitti said.

He was struck by a Chevy S10 pickup truck heading east in the left lane. The driver, a 45-year-old man from Lodi, has not been charged, Fugnitti said.
