An astonishing 68 million Americans care for a parent, spouse, child, sibling, or friend with a physical or developmental disability, mental illness, or issues of aging. Here in our northern New Jersey region, more than 260,000 of our residents are unpaid family caregivers.

These unpaid family caregivers are the backbone of our nation's health care system, providing 80 percent of long-term care in the home. If they stopped providing this essential day-to-day care, our health care system would be crippled by the added cost and stress on services.

For 10 years, United Way of Northern New Jersey has worked closely with family caregivers. We know the struggles caregivers face as they balance caregiving with work and family obligations. We see how often caregivers put their own physical, emotional, and financial health at risk. 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
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
