If you are a current member of a genealogical society that is incorporated or authorized to do business or conduct affairs in CT, you are entitled to access all vital records except confidential files on adoption, paternity, gender re-assignment and gestational agreements. Genealogists are permitted to make notes and purchase certified copies of such records. Also note that genealogists may not have access to the social security numbers on vital records consistent with federal law.
