# Día de los Muertos


Jueves el 2 de Noviembre

Dia de los Muertos is a celebration of our loved ones who have gone before us. Bring a momento or photo to place on the alter.





A singer/songwriter with a soul edge. Steve delivers his brand of blue-eyed-soul-Americana-pop in the tradition of Bruno Mars, Daryl Hall, Sam Cooke and Bill Withers. His love for melody is woven deeply into the chordal fabric of his songs, making his music rich, sultry, and delicious.

An Oregon native, Steve Hale has been a singer, songwriter and producer in the Northwest for many years. He's played and toured in many different bands with varying styles; from soul, to power pop (Kashmir), to glam funk (RIA), to bringing it back to the source with a single guitar and voice. He has recently been involved with composing music for the modern dance troupe; Fuse Dance Force. He's won an international song writing contest, co-authored three songs with Gino Vannelli on his album "These Are The Days" and was the lead singer in The Steve Farris Project (guitar player from Mr. Mister). He has worked with Playwrite helping youth find their voice through writing music, has sung back up and played on numerous international, national and local artists recordings, as well as doing vocals for radio spots and promotional materials. He has produced two heartfelt and soul filled albums of his own material: "Illusion" and "Words, Wire & Wood" as well as a Christmas album entitled "The Spirit of Christmas". Born and raised in Salem, Oregon he now resides in Lake Oswego.

As well as doing his original material Steve is also playing bass in an 80's band; Nu Wave Machine, a blues folk group The Rob Rainwater Trio, an improvisational pop band by the name of Canoofle, and a three part harmony CSNY inspired project; The Mark Bosnian Trio. # Rebuilding the David B.

## CHOICES IN PRESERVATION FOR THE RESTORATION OF THE MOTOR VESSEL DAVID B

In the spring of 1998 Captain Jeffrey and Christine Smith found and fell in love with the M/V David B, an old wooden boat built in 1929. It was just the boat they were looking for to restore, and to offer small ship adventure cruises. What was originally supposed to be a two-year restoration project, took over eight years of blood, sweat, and uncertainty to make their dreams become reality.

The M/V David B was built in 1929 and is a beautifully restored 65-foot wooden workboat that has been converted to carry passengers for adventure cruises in Alaska. Besides being a unique boat and one of the last remaining Bristol Bay, Alaska cannery tenders from the days of sail-only commercial fishing, the David B is still powered by its museum quality antique engine, a last-of-its-kind 3-cylinder Washington-Estep.

Jeffrey and Christine Smith: Captain Jeffrey loves teaching about anything mechanical, and would love to show you the charts or explain how the David B's GPS navigational system works. After thousands of hours on the waters of the Pacific Northwest, he is adept at spotting wildlife and has become somewhat of a naturalist. Christine Smith started working on tour and whale watching boats in 2001. It combined her love for nature and her interest in helping others to enjoy it. She's also the award-winning author of *More Faster Backwards: Rebuilding David B* where she chronicles challenges of restoring the David B and the excitement of taking the boat to Alaska for the first time.

Join Jeffrey and Christine for slideshow presentation on the choices they made in restoring the David B and discussion of what it's like to cruise the Inside Passage and Alaska.


Our instructor, Caitlin MacDowell, has sold over a hundred hand-made frames. She sells her frames, cards and gift tags at a gift store in Welches.

## STAFF PICKS



In searching out books for kids on the topic of Thanksgiving, I came across *The Mayflower and the Pilgrim's New World*, by Nathaniel Philbrick. Although adapted for young readers from the original bestseller, *Mayflower*, I found it a wonderful read as an adult. At 338 pages it covers the topic at a delightful pace and yet is full of detail from original drawings, diaries, maps and, from more recent days, photographs. The overall tone of the book is of the remarkable and courageous accomplishment of the Pilgrims, but written in such a way as to point out errors of some of their decisions and actions without disrespect to their humanity and religious devotion. Their treatment of the Native Americans is divulged in all fairness to cause sympathy and understanding but without undo criticism. The author seems to want to clarify some myths that have grown over time and yet acknowledge why the historical events have been so venerated. He says this is "The Story We Need to Know."
