Miami-Dade County Emergency Evacuation Assistance Program:

Energy Assistance (Low Income Home Energy Assistance

Program :LIHEAP): The program provides assistance to low-income individuals and families who are experiencing difficulty in paying for utilities such as electricity and gas. This assistance is provided in the form of a credit on an existing utility bill. Open for application Monday-Thursday 8:00 a.m. - 12:00 p.m. Documentation needed: Photo ID, proof of income and disability/ seniors 60+.
