WHAT IS A NEIGHBORHOOD WATCH?

The Neighborhood Watch Program is a crime prevention program that enlists the active participation of residents in cooperation with law enforcement to reduce crime, solve problems, and improve the quality of life in your area. By being involved in a Neighborhood Watch Program, you will get to know and work with your neighbors and learn how to:

- Recognize and report crimes and suspicious activities
- Protect yourself, family, neighbors and property
- Identify crime and disorder problems in your area and work with law enforcement to solve them.

WHO CAN BE INVOLVED?

Any community resident can join. Even the busiest of people can belong to a Neighborhood Watch, as they too can keep an eye out for neighbors as they come and go.

THE COMPONENTS OF A NEIGHBORHOOD WATCH:

- Community meetings. These should be set up on a regular basis such as monthly or bi-monthly.
- Communications. These can be as simple as a flyer posted on a community announcement board to a newsletter that updates neighbors on the progress of the program.
- Special Events. These are crucial to keep the program going and growing. Host talks or seminars that focus on current issues.
 Sponsor a block party, holiday dinner, or other community event that will provide neighbors with a chance to get to know each other.
- Participation in National Night Out. This
 event is held nationwide each year on the
 first Tuesday in August. This is an event
 which brings the community together in
 the fight against crime.
- Citizen's Police Academy. Participants are given an opportunity to participate in the Citizen Police Academy. This program meets one evening a week for 12 weeks. Each week participants are educated on different aspects of law enforcement, given an inside look at the workings of the Wheeling Police Department, and it is the first step to becoming a Neighborhood Assistant Volunteer.
