SUBJECT: FY18-21 CIP Budget: Mid-Year Update and Submission to City of Livermore's

Bi-Annual CIP Budget

RECOMMENDATIONS:

1. That the Facilities Committee recommends that the Board of Directors approve the District's Mid-Year update to its FY18-21 Capital Improvement Plan (CIP) budget.

2. That the Facilities Committee recommends that the Board of Directors approve the District's submission to the City of Livermore's two-year CIP budget for AB1600 fund use.

BACKGROUND:

- 1. At mid-year, the District reassesses its Approved three-year CIP Budget and presents proposed revisions to the Board of Directors for approval. Before reviewing with the Board, proposed revisions are reviewed by the Facilities Committee, whose guidance is then reflected in a subsequent review with the Finance Committee (currently slated for March 5, 2019). Feedback from both committees is reflected in a Board Budget Workshop and Board of Directors meeting, which, this year, are scheduled for March 13th.
 - a. **Attachment A** provides a summary of the District's updated plans for CIP spending versus the Approved Budget.
- 2. Every two years, the City of Livermore, with whom the District shares AB1600 funds, updates its CIP Budget; LARPD's plans for AB1600 fund usage are incorporated in the City's biannual budgeting process.
 - a. **Attachment B** provides an updated view of LARPD's planned use of AB1600 funds, including spending plans for current projects that are consistent with Attachment A as well as preliminary plans for other projects envisioned by the District in FY19-21 that have previously been discussed in the Facilities and Finance Committees.
 - b. Funding Sources
 - i. AB1600: developer fees shared by the District and the City of Livermore to be used for public parks and intended for capital improvement programs in response to development projects that will impact service levels for public infrastructure, which includes, but is not limited to, Park and Recreation

infrastructure. AB1600 allows for reimbursement of costs incurred to address increased demand for public facilities reasonably attributed to development projects in order to refurbish existing facilities to maintain the existing level of service or achieve an adopted level of service that is consistent with the City's General Plan.

c. General Fund

- i. Committed reserve funds that are targeted for CIP initiatives that do not meet the criteria for AB1600 or other funding sources (targeted funds such as grants and trusts).
- d. Trusts and Grants
 - i. Typically establish specific spending guidelines for use (e.g., Buckley Trust).

1. Mid-Year CIP Budget Update: FY18-21

Staff has updated its forecast of spending for Priority A projects, reflecting total project spend estimates and project timing, and the results of that work are summarized in Attachment A as follows:

- a. Spend to date for FY18-19 versus the Approved Budget;
- b. The Approved CIP budget by fiscal year;
- c. The District's proposed Mid-Year CIP Budget update; and
- d. A comparison of the Mid-Year CIP Budget Proposal vs the Approved CIP Budget by fiscal year.

2. SUBMISSION TO THE CITY OF LIVERMORE'S BI-ANNUAL CIP BUDGET PROCESS (AB1600 Fund Focus)

The AB1600 funding assumptions related to staff's proposed CIP Budget update are reflected in Staff's recommended submission to the City's bi-annual CIP Budget process. For the District's submission to the City, Staff has included preliminary estimates for projects that have not been formally approved by the Board but which have been reviewed in both the Facilities and Finance Committees in recent meetings. These projects include:

- a. Bill Clark Playground renovation (\$1.0 million in AB1600 funding in addition to \$100,000 received from Signature Homes);
- b. Tex Spruiell Park renovation, including irrigation system (\$1.7 million);
- c. Tex Spruiell Playground renovation (\$1.2 million); and
- d. Independence Park irrigation system upgrade (\$1.7 million).

Staff continues to consider alternative approaches to the District's Playground renovations, but the aforementioned projects reflect current thinking.
